

**DR. CLARENCE M. GLENN  
LEGAL NOTICE**

Notice from the Alabama State Board of Veterinary  
Medical Examiners. RE: Dr. Clarence M. Glenn  
Respondent, Huntsville, AL.

On June 21, 2012, the Alabama State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners issued a Final Order, effective June 21, 2012, in connection with violations of the Veterinary Practice Act. Dr. Clarence M. Glenn was found guilty of six separate rule violations of the Practice Act, with the opinion of the Administrative Law Judge and affirmation of the Board, Dr. Clarence M. Glenn was disciplined, fined and/or obligated in the following manner:

Dr. Clarence M. Glenn's license to engage in the practice of veterinary medicine in the State of Alabama will be suspended for a period of six (6) months;

Dr. Clarence M. Glenn's Alabama State Control Substance Registration has been suspended for a period of six (6) months to run concurrently with Dr. Clarence M. Glenn's license suspension;

Dr. Clarence M. Glenn's Premise Permit for his hospital will be suspended. The Premise Permit will remain suspended until the Respondent's above listed facility passes re-inspection. Upon re-inspection, the Respondent's Premise Permit will be issued, however it will remain in probationary status for a period of five (5) years from the date of re-issue, with unannounced semiannual inspections, at the Respondent's cost for the duration of probation;

Administrative Fines in the amount of \$2,500.00 have been imposed and are to be paid to the Board subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Final Order.

In the event that Dr. Clarence M. Glenn decides, voluntarily or involuntarily, to remove himself from the practice of veterinary medicine with the Glenn's Animal Hospital, the provisions of the Consent Order will remain in full force and effect.

A Final Order, incorporating the Consent Order, is a matter of public record consistent with the Board's Rules and Regulations. If Dr. Clarence M. Glenn, his respective spouse, counsel or agent, publish false information concerning the nature of the investigation, the complaint, or the resolution of the complaint, the Board, in its sole discretion, may release to interested parties such information as is necessary to respond to the false information.

Failure to comply with the terms of the Final Order prohibiting fraud, theft by deception, gross incompetence, gross negligence, dishonesty, or intentional cruelty or inhumane treatment to animals entrusted to the Respondent shall be deemed as express consent of Respondent, respectively, to the immediate revocation of his license without the filing of a formal complaint. Revocation proceedings will be held and the only issue to be determined is, whether, in fact, the terms of the Final Order have been violated. Revocation shall become effective upon the Board's determination that a violation has, in fact, occurred.
